Some Bits of Parish News

- An application is in place for tall pine tree removal as it has split AND is currently hugged by a strangler fig (Bonney Ave south corner). This will cost a few thousand to remove.
- ⇒ The poinciana on the corner is causing a little concern with dropping quite weighty branches onto the pedestrian footpath
- ⇒ Two front pews are being fixed and altered slightly to allow them to be placed in the upper sanctuary.
- ⇒ The kitchen is acquiring a new Zip boiler (approx. \$2000) as the last one is deceased
- ⇒ We have purchased a new noticeboard (\$700)
- ⇒ Containers for Change brings us around \$80 each month
- ⇒ Recent electricity bill for the church/hall was over \$700 for 3 months
- ⇒ Unfortunately, under the hall we have 41 concrete stumps in need of replacement. This will cost at least \$14,000.

GOSPEL READING - Mark 9: 2-10

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark, chapter 9, beginning at the 2nd verse

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

² Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, ³ and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. ⁴ And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. ⁵ Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' ⁶ He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. ⁷ Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!' ⁸ Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.

⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. ¹⁰ So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what this rising from the dead could mean.
